Establishment

This Prize has been established by the University as a result of a contribution by The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers.

In support of the prize IEEE shall provide to the University \$500.00 (GST free). The prize will be presented to the candidate at the IEEE South Australia Section Student Papers Night in October of each year.

Value

The value of the Prize will be \$500.00.

Eligibility

The prize is open to students who are enrolled in the Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) Electrical and Electronic or any Bachelor of Engineering program (including associated double or combined degrees) offered by the School of Electrical and Electronic Engineering and must have completed at least one of the below courses in the year for which the prize is awarded.

Selection of Candidate

The Head of the School of Electrical and Electronic Engineering will award the prize annually to the student with the best overall academic performance in the following Electrical and Electronic Engineering Level II courses:

ELEC ENG 2100 Digital Systems
ELEC ENG 2101 Electronic Circuits
ELEC ENG 2102 Electric Energy Conversion
ELEC ENG 2104 Digital Signal Processing

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in a given year then the prize will not be awarded in that year and the money will be used in subsequent years.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize shall be shared equally.

Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the original objectives of the prize.
